

The road isn't straight....the road isn't straight and sometimes you have to choose a different route. The road isn't straight and sometimes you even get lost. The road isn't straight and sometimes you cross paths with what you least expected. The road isn't straight and yet God is always with us....

Happy New Year, Zion. We journey into a new year together with hearts full of hope and joy as we rejoice in the birth of our Lord and Savior. We all find ourselves, yet again, facing a year of newness and possibility. Perhaps we are feeling a bit lost or confused. Maybe we are feeling ready and stocked up for all we will need on this next part of the journey. It is also possible that we are feeling out of breath and in need of a break. Our Monday morning Bible study group has been reading from an Advent devotional titled "Sanctified Art, Words for the Beginning". This devotion provides moments of pause and reflection through poems, scripture, and art. The reflection for Epiphany is titled "The Road Isn't Straight". We are invited into the story of the Magi from Matthew 2: 1-12. The Magi are on their way to the Messiah. They are coming from the East and following a star. Hello everyone! January is Mental Wellness Month. The holiday season can be a very stressful and difficult time for many people, especially those that have experienced the loss of a loved one this time of year or are experiencing health challenges. Your mental health directly affects your physical and emotional well-being, so it is important you are taking care of yourselves. Self-care is different for everyone, but here are some ways you can practice self-care:

- ⇒ Exercise even if it's brief. This could be as simple as cleaning up spaces in your home or putting up decorations. Any movement is better than no movement.
- ⇒ Reading can provide a sense of relaxation and entertainment, especially on a cold wintry day
- ⇒ Meditation, prayer, and mindfulness can calm the mind, especially after a busy day of hosting holiday activities
- ⇒ Practicing gratitude Life can become very busy and overwhelming, especially this time of year, so it's important to take a few moments each day to share what you're grateful for whether you write it down in a journal or share during friendly conversations take a moment to be present with yourself and others
- ⇒ Journaling can be beneficial, especially if you've had a busy day. Take a few moments to reflect on your day and everything you've accomplished
- ⇒ Getting enough rest Sleep gives our bodies the opportunity to recover from the activities of the day, refreshes our mind for the next day, and gives us a break from stress or challenges we may be facing. 8 hours of sleep is ideal for full physical rest and recovery
- ⇒ Being creative, whether you like to paint, draw, color, sew, crochet, knit, do holiday or DIY crafts, bake or cook a new recipe, journal, etc. The opportunities to express yourself and creativity are endless, and may bring joy to others
- ⇒ Maintaining physical hygiene showering, getting a haircut, getting a manicure or pedicure, doing your makeup, applying deodorant or perfume/cologne, applying lotion to dry skin or chap stick to dry lips, keeping your eyeglasses clean, etc. are all ways to maintain your physical hygiene. These tasks may seem simple, but for people that are experiencing depression, may take a lot of energy, physically and mentally


